Sociology Department

The Sociology Department is one of the departments within the Faculty of Arts at Derna University. It began accepting students upon its establishment in (1999-2000 AD) as a division within the Behavioral Sciences Department. At its inception, the university was named Derna University, and the academic year system was adopted until the academic year 2022-2023 AD, when it transitioned to the semester system, which is the current system in the faculty. Students study for eight semesters, after which they obtain a Bachelor's degree in Sociology. The department has graduated (21 cohorts), with a total of 674 graduates (194 males and 490 females).

- 6. Contributing to the dissemination of scientific knowledge in the field of sociology in line with the development of science, and providing consultations and conducting research and studies for public and private institutions and organizations in society.
- 7. Developing scientific knowledge by encouraging outstanding students to pursue postgraduate studies.
