History Department

An academic program that meets the needs of society in historical studies using modern methods and qualified competencies, striving to contribute to the development of society and the consolidation of its national, Arab, and Islamic identity by studying the past to understand the present and anticipate the future. The Department of History was established in (1996-1997).

At the time of its establishment, the university was named Omar Al-Mukhtar University. Until the academic year 2023-2024, (25) cohorts have graduated from the department, totaling 549 students, including (191) males and (358) females.

Department Vision

To achieve scientific leadership locally and regionally, disseminate historical knowledge, and strive for educational and research excellence regionally and globally, and to spread historical knowledge.

Department Mission

To prepare researchers connected to the Libyan, Arab, Islamic, and human historical heritage, capable of understanding the course of its events, studying the causes of its changes and the problems that faced its societies, interpreting events, interacting with the requirements of the contemporary era, equipped with knowledge and analytical skills, and capable of planning for the future.

- 4. To ensure that the study of history is renewed and not stagnant, keeping pace with developments.

- 7. To provide consultations and expertise and participate in public and private projects by establishing relationships with the community and its scientific and
